Read Mark 5:1-34 in your language. Then read the story: **Jesus Heals a Demon-Possessed Man and a Sick Woman**



Jesus and his disciples went in their boat to the place where the Gerasene people lived. When Jesus got out of the boat, a man came to him from the caves where the dead are buried.

This man had an evil spirit living inside him. He lived there by the tombs. He was always screaming and cutting himself with stones. He was so strong that nobody could tie him up.

Sometimes people even put chains on his arms and legs, but

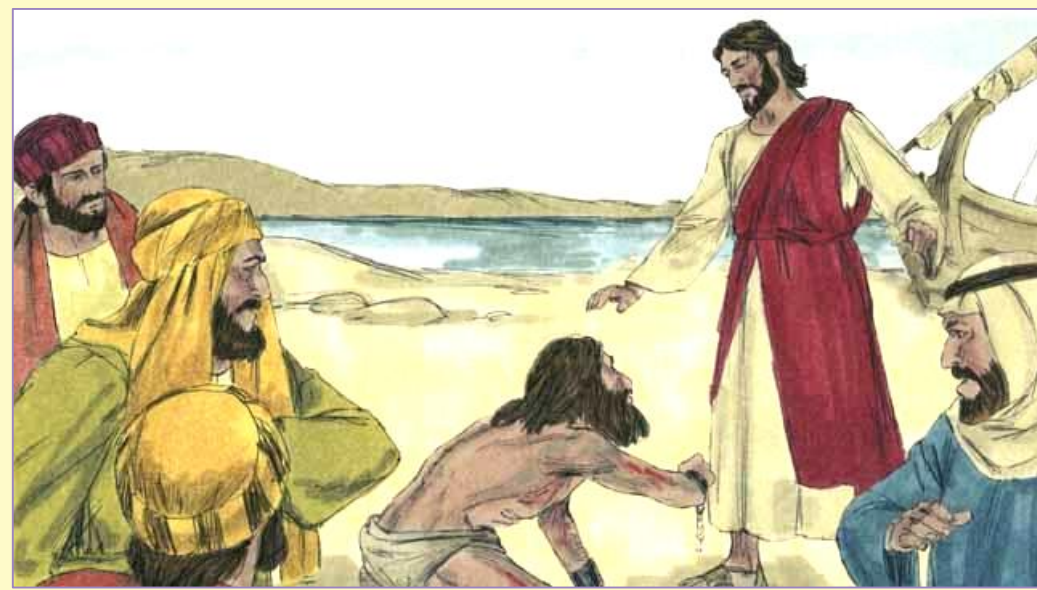
he broke the chains. The man ran up to Jesus and knelt down in front of him.

Then Jesus spoke to the demon in the man and said, "Come out of this man!"

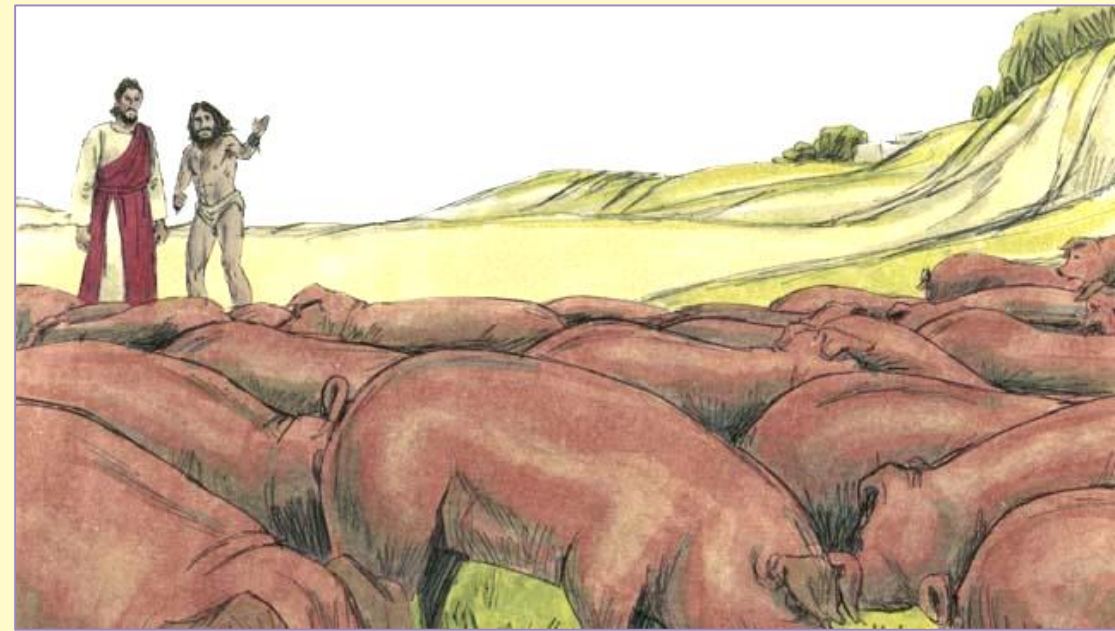
The demon shouted, "What do you want with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? Please do not torture me!"

Then Jesus asked the demon, "What is your name?"

He replied, "My name is Legion because we are many."



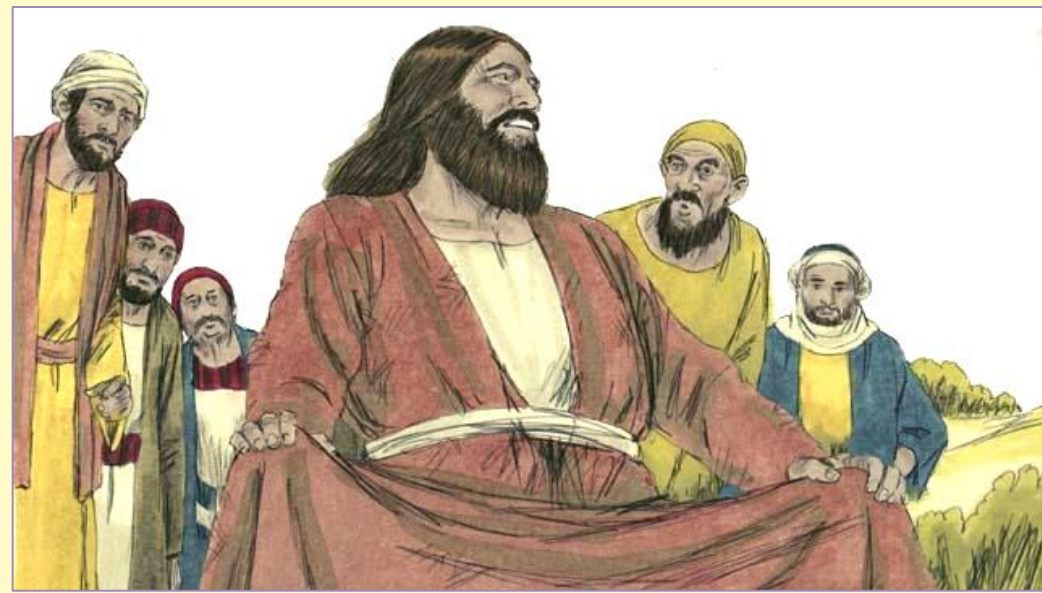
There was a large herd of pigs feeding on a nearby hill. The demons begged Jesus, "If we must leave, please send us into that herd of pigs instead!" So, Jesus let them do this.



Then the demons came out of the man and went into the pigs. The herd of pigs ran down a steep bank into the lake and all of them drowned.

There were about 2,000 pigs in the herd.

The men who worked taking care of those pigs saw what happened. They ran into the town. There they told everyone what Jesus had done.



The people from the town came and saw the man who used to have the demons. He was sitting calmly, wearing clothes, and acting like a normal person.

The people were very afraid and begged Jesus to leave their town. So, Jesus got into the boat to go back to Galilee. The man who used to have the demons begged to go along with Jesus.

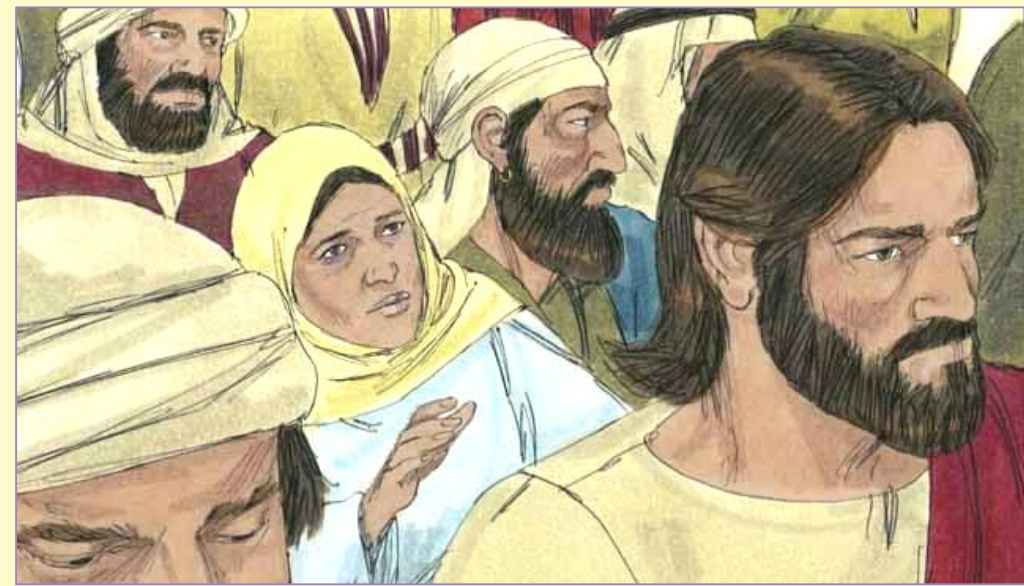


But Jesus said to him, "No. I want you to go home and tell everyone what God has done for you. Tell them how the Lord was good to you."




So, the man went away and told everyone about what Jesus had done for him. Everyone who heard his story was amazed.

Jesus returned to the other side of the lake. After he arrived there, a large crowd gathered around him and pushed close to him. In the crowd was a woman who had suffered from a bleeding problem for 12 years.



She had paid all of her money to doctors, but no doctor was able to heal her. She only got worse.

She heard that Jesus healed many sick people. She thought, "I'm sure that if I can just touch Jesus' clothes, then I will be healed!" She came behind Jesus and touched the bottom of his robe. As soon as she touched his robe, the bleeding stopped!



Immediately, Jesus felt that power had gone out from him. So, he turned around and asked, "Who touched me?"



The disciples replied, "There are many people crowding around you and pushing into you. Why did you ask, 'Who touched me?'"

The woman fell on her knees before Jesus, shaking and very afraid. Then she told him the whole story.

Jesus said to her, "Daughter, Your faith has healed you. Go in peace."


