**A**rgentina

**B**arbados

**T**ower of **B**abel

**A**rctic **S**ea

**T**own **H**ospital

**M**r., **M**rs., **M**iss and **M**s.

The wife of Joseph	Joseph's wife
The son of Mary	Mary's son
The father of Isaac	Isaac's father
The mother of the girl	The girl's mother

# Irregular Verbs - Listen and repeat.

Base form	Past Simple	Sentence
buy	bought	I <b>bought</b> two hot drinks.
do	did	We <b>did</b> a big job.
go	went	They <b>went</b> to the small house.
have	had	I <b>had</b> a big breakfast.
say	said	He <b>said</b> the cup was empty.
see	saw	We <b>saw</b> the soft sofa.

Did you <b>have</b> a hot drink yesterday?	No, I <b>didn't have</b> a hot drink.	I <b>had</b> a cold drink.
Did he <b>buy</b> a big meal?	No, he <b>didn't buy</b> a big meal.	He <b>bought</b> a small meal.
Did they <b>see</b> an old man at the door?	No, they <b>didn't see</b> an old man.	They <b>saw</b> a young man.

6. good	*better		My English is better than before.
7. bad	*worse		My grades were worse last month.



# Listen and repeat.

We use **would like** to be polite when we request or offer something.

The contraction for **would like** = **'d like**

Request	Offer
I <b>would like</b> a return ticket.	<b>Would you</b> like a receipt?
<b>He'd like</b> a cup of coffee.	<b>Would he</b> like sugar?
<b>We'd like</b> to travel to Rome.	<b>Would you like</b> to go by bus or by train?
<b>She'd like</b> to wait for the next train.	<b>Would she like</b> to sit down?



# Listen and repeat.

<b>Question</b>	<b>Positive</b>	<b>Negative</b>
How would you like to travel?	I'd like to travel by bus.	I wouldn't like to travel by aeroplane.
Would he like a return ticket?	Yes, he would.	No, he wouldn't.





# Like and Would Like: Listen and repeat.

Question ?	Positive +	Negative -
<b>Do</b> you <b>like</b> to play football?	Yes, I always <b>like</b> to play football.	No, I <b>don't like</b> to play football.
<b>Does</b> he <b>like</b> to exercise?	Yes, he <b>likes</b> to exercise every day.	No, he <b>doesn't like</b> to exercise.
<b>Would</b> you <b>like</b> to practise now?	Yes, I'd <b>like</b> to practise.	No, I <b>wouldn't like</b> to practise.
<b>Would</b> she <b>like</b> to walk tomorrow?	Yes, she'd <b>like</b> to walk.	No, she <b>wouldn't like</b> to walk.



# Quotation marks “ ” and commas ,

Quotation marks show the words someone said. Commas go between the words **said** or **asked** and the quotation marks.

Jesus said, “Every person who believes in me will be saved.”

God said, “I have heard your prayers.”

Jesus asked, “Who do you say I am?”

Peter said, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.”
